

#### ABOUT SWF

Singapore Writers Festival (SWF), which celebrates its 21st edition this year, is regarded as one of Asia's premier literary events. Founded in 1986 as Singapore Writers' Week, it is one of the few literary festivals in the world which is multi-lingual, celebrating works in Singapore's four official languages – English, Malay, Chinese and Tamil – as well as other languages. Over the years, SWF has become an exciting meeting point of writers and thinkers in a choice spread of lectures, panel discussions, workshops, masterclasses and performances in 10 days. It has hosted literati the likes of Nobel Prize winner Gao Xingjian, Whitbread Book Awards First Novel winner Tash Aw, British poet laureate Carol Ann Duffy, Nebula winner Neil Gaiman and Pulitzer Prize winners Michael Cunningham and Vijay Seshadri. This year, the Festival will be housed in the Empress Place district among historic buildings such as The Arts House, National Gallery Singapore and the Asian Civilisations Museum.
















#### **FOREWORDS**







It's a coming-of-age: As Singapore Writers Festival (SWF) celebrates its 21st edition this year, one marvels at how far the Singapore literary scene has come. Just a decade ago, you'd be lucky to have more than a handful of audience members attending a poetry reading, or a book launch, and the saddest thing is, they were likely to be friends of the speakers, or worse, fellow speakers waiting for their turn to read.

Fast forward to 2018, and the literary landscape is thriving. Despite the worrying trend of fewer students taking up literature at the upper school level, there are now more published poets, fiction writers and creative non-fiction writers. A couple of months ago, there were five – yes, five – literary events one could attend in one weekend. You could zip from a launch of an English-language book of essays at a Chinese bookstore to a literary-musical showcase at the Esplanade to a poetry book launch with dance interpretations at \*SCAPE within minutes of one another.

Clearly, Singaporeans have come to realise the power of words to move, to advocate, and, well, to have a good time. Here at SWF, we value words. It's crucial to show how a word (or a character) can have shades of meanings when applied in different contexts and across languages. That is why we have chosen as this year's festival theme the Chinese character, 界 (jiè), as part of our direction in adopting a theme from one of Singapore's mother tongues. In 2016, we explored dual meanings of love and loss with the Malay word 'Sayang', and in 2017, we dived into the richly philosophical 'Aram', a Tamil term which broadly means "goodness".界 also possesses multiple meanings, ranging from the universe to also borders and the liminal state of imagination.

The theme asks us to consider the world(s) we are living in. Aside from presenting texts in interdisciplinary offerings like the late-night experience, The Ghost in Your Head, and paving tribute to the social conscience of hip-hop at the performance, Str8 Up: Word on the Street, SWF wants to explore two aspects of today's society: technology and the environment. Together with Goethe-Institut Singapore, we welcome you to venture into a virtual reality (VR) room and experience Franz Kafka's Metamorphosis; and come listen to media studies professor Miriam Meckel as she examines brainhacking. Elsewhere, we will explore new-fangled creations such as cryptocurrency and artificial intelligence, culminating in the popular SWF Closing Debate as stalwarts Gwee Li Sui and Adrian Tan exchange witticisms with newbies Preetipls and Darvl Qilin Yam on whether Singaporeans are better off with the ubiquitous social media.

On the eco-front, we want everyone to be cognizant of the impact of human activity upon the planet we are inhabiting. Let's take a serious look at our actions and their long-term effects. We have invited Jeff Goodell, who travelled to Alaska with former US president Barack Obama, who will share how climate change affects sea levels and how that in turn affects us all, while Zero Waste SG will present a talk on The Microplastic Crisis. In terms of our own efforts, SWF is committed to spreading the eco-conscious message by reducing the use of plastic in and around the Festival.

So, do join us for 10 days of sharing ideas on how we can make this world we live in a better place - and let your mind and heart expand.









Any writers festival in any part of the world would be special in one way or another. But I'd like to think that the Singapore Writers Festival, located within Southeast Asia, is special in stimulating reflection on, as this year's tagline goes, "the world(s) we live in". Indeed, SWF 2018 raises fundamental questions in an increasingly globalised but also increasingly divided world. As much as environmental crises show us that "we" – humanity – live together on one fragile planet, recent history suggests that polarisation between nations, and groups within nations, is more invidious than ever before.

SWF has been special in the use of vernacular words as a springboard for public discussion. Following the theme of sayang in Malay and aram in Tamil, this year's theme is 界 (jiè), a Chinese character that combines the pictorial element,  $\boxplus$  (tián), of a field (resembling the padi fields in our region) and a phonetic element 介 (jiè), which in turn represents the lines separating human beings. Hence, two meanings are conjoined: the idea of a "world" (not just a physical field but also a social or symbolic realm) and the corresponding idea of "boundaries".

This theme is resonant in multi-ethnic and multireligious Singapore. Next year marks 200 years from the beginning of British colonialism in Singapore. Yet, among Singaporeans, there has been growing consciousness of a much longer - seven centuries history of exchange and interaction among peoples in maritime Asia. Before the arrival of the British, our ancestors in the Malay Archipelago have had to learn to communicate with and learn from each other. Much has been discussed about the colonial policy of divide-and-rule through the use of racial categories. In spite of the colonial legacy, Singaporeans, in the words recited daily by our schoolchildren, "pledge ourselves as one united people, regardless of race, language or religion, to build a democratic society, based on justice and equality".

This pledge also behoves us to understand and transcend the boundaries that tend to divide us. I learned from friends that the idea of boundaries can

be expressed in different Malay and Tamil words. For example, one translation of jiè in Malay is batas ("limits") – the verb membatasi suggests the act of demarcating and defining. In Tamil, one translation is ສານັ້ງ (pronounced ellai), which not only applies to spatial boundaries, but also to social behaviour. In any case, such conversations have also generated insights on whether man-made boundaries are in fact porous and negotiable, and how they can be transcended. In encouraging this kind of intercultural dialogue at SWF 2018, four final-year students of the Intercultural Theatre Institute will present Between Earth and Heaven – Four Monodramas in multiple tongues.

As in previous years, SWF is also special in ensuring that, along with the programming in English, literary works – and public discussion – in Malay, Tamil, and Chinese have a significant presence. There are indeed fascinating social and literary worlds within Singapore, worlds that also connect us with the rest of Asia and beyond.

Literary works in Malay, Tamil, and Chinese have continued to enrich our literary landscape. Translation of such writings into English and vernacular languages have also enabled Singaporeans to deepen their understanding of each other. This year, SWF is presenting Yeng Pway Ngon, the Cultural Medallion recipient for Literature in 2003 as our Literary Pioneer, whose illustrious body of works chronicles the inner lives of individuals amid social and political change.

Every participant in SWF 2018 has the difficult but happy problem of selecting from more than 330 events! We wish all of you a most enjoyable experience as you make time for as many events as you wish – and as you reflect on the many challenges of the world(s) we live in.



Commonly used terms of "Singaporean Chinese literature" or "Malaysian Chinese literature" do not include various works of classical Chinese literature from the 15th century (Ming Dynasty) onwards. Vernacular Chinese literature has an even narrower definition, excluding many outstanding diasporic Chinese writers. For example, Malayan Chinese literature rejected the works of writers who took up Singaporean citizenship after the Separation of Singapore and Malaysia, and likewise, the works of writers who had chosen Malaysia as their home was excluded from Singaporean Chinese literature, Many writers were labelled as returning overseas Chinese writers or migrant Chinese writers. This panel will discuss the need to redraw the literary map and review the writers in a new light.







Indefatigable in his pursuit of dissecting the human condition, Yeng, who is also a poet, playwright and critic, has developed a distinct literary style of wry, absurdist humour and a dualistic perspective that interweaves the personal with the social. Encompassing notions of contradiction, hope, regret, and desire, his timeless stories and characters hold up a candid mirror to society, revealing the beauty and flaws of our existence.

Commonly used terms of "Singaporean Chinese literature" or "Malaysian Chinese literature" do not include various works of classical Chinese literature from the 15th century (Ming Dynasty) onwards. Vernacular Chinese literature has an even narrower definition, excluding many outstanding diasporic Chinese writers. For example, Malayan Chinese literature rejected the works of writers who took up Singaporean citizenship after the Separation of Singapore and Malaysia, and likewise, the works of writers who had chosen Malaysia as their home was excluded from Singaporean Chinese literature. Many writers were labelled as returning overseas Chinese writers or migrant Chinese writers. This panel will discuss the need to redraw the literary map and review the writers in a new light.

Following a long decade of hibernation after the millennium, May Poetry Society and May Poetry Journal were revived via 2 recent reforms, one in 2014 (issue 40) and one in 2018 (issue 43), whereby the editors focus on interesting design concept and rebranding, interaction with readers, a theme per issue and an editors-n-rotation system. With the aim of transforming existing marketing and operational models, the journal has also published the electronic version of the past 40-odd issues on http://issuu.com/sgmaypoetry.



MEGURU HINOMOTO JAPAN

Pak Nobat has entered and received accolades in various competitions. Inspired by their coined slogan "Nondengan Orang Barat Atau Timur" ("The Sway of East and West"), Pak Nobat strives to strengthen friendship among Singapore's dikir barat activists.



PATRICK YEE SINGAPORE PG 42, 83

Patrick Yee is a published author and illustrator of more than 100 children's books. Some of his works include Little Buddy, Rosie Rabbit, Winter Rabbit and On Being Happy.

Born in Tokyo in 1960, Yoko Tawada moved to Hamburg when she was 22, and then to Berlin in 2006. She writes in Japanese and German, and has published stories, novels, poems, plays and essays – in both languages.
